Who is Canadian Softwood Inspection?

Canadian Softwood Inspection Agency, Inc. What are the responsibilities of a CSI Field Representative?

As a CSI Field Representative, you will be responsible for the sampling and/or auditing of wood products to verify compliance to applicable standards and quality programs. You will also be monitoring plant records and training production staff. Because of the broad range of services offered by CSI, no two days are alike. Servicing a territory of various wood processing facilities, each day will require travel to and from different locations. Each CSI Field Representative works independently from a remote location, but is part of a pod of representatives that is overseen by a supervisor who provides support and assistance.

What the benefits of working for CSI?
